How is education organized? (E.g. study forms, academic level, examination, workload, lesson material)

Education is barely organized, the classes are in Portuguese, most professors almost never answer any emails and it is really hard to find them on the university grounds. The workload is very low because they just give you a paper and/or a presentation to make. The professors don't get paid for having Erasmus students in their class so they don't want to do any extra work for us.

What is the culture of the university? (E.g. How approachable are the lecturers, engagement with local students? What are the differences with the WUR?)

There are a lot of differences, I cannot really tell a lot about it though because classes were in Portuguese and there was no point for me to go there really.

What does the university offer the student additionally? (E.g. Catering, sports facilities, medical services?) The catering in the residences is very good, cheap meals. Also the student gym is very good, large and a good price.

5. Housing-living-public transport

What are the possibilities for housing? (E.g. Availability to sign up for a room on campus, private rooms, rent rates?)

When you go there they give you a room in the residences but I was surprised when I got there because there were 4 people in my room. This is okay if you are used to having a shared bedroom (which was also the living room as there was only one room). I moved out as soon as possible to an apartment in the city, the problem is you go to Vila Real in the winter is that it will be cold as there is no central heating anywhere.

What is the culture of the country like? (E.g. Differences with home, local cuisine, habits, manners?) The culture is awesome, the people are great.

Could you give a general price indication of the place of residence compared to living in Wageningen? I would say it is not a lot cheaper, the housing and restaurants are cheaper but I didn't notice any real price differences in stores and supermarkets.

Could you give some information about public transport infrastructure? (E.g. Cost public transport card, taxi prices, how to travel to the university?)

There is a bus (1 euro per ride) but don't be surprised if it doesn't come at all and you have to wait another half hour. The best is to just walk to the university, from the center of the city this is about 20-25 minutes.
