Why did you choose to go on study exchange?

The reason why I wanted to go on an exchange program is, to expand my knowledge and broaden my vision within the field of ecosystem ecology. I better wanted to understand the role of biodiversity ecosystem functioning and the underlying theory. Additionally, I wanted to experience other cultures to better understand different viewpoints and discretions between our communities on the related topic. I think this creates a valuable bridge between communities where understanding and communication can serve us in dealing with future challenges. How is the study formalized? (E.g. study forms, academic level, examination, workload, lesson material)

It is a master course, workload is more than fine if you put in the effort, it is well structured in general and the teachers and adjacent research assistants really go out of their way to help you during the course. The examination is done through a test on the theoretical basis that you learn during lectures/seminars and a final presentation on the topic of your self-designed experiment.

What is the culture of the university? (E.g. How approachable are the lecturers, engagement with local students? What are the differences with the WUR?)

Lectures and personal interaction within the course are fine, you are encouraged to engage in discourses through seminars, group work and experimentation. Local students are open and friendly towards incoming students, the culture itself feels more distant though, it takes time to be integrated outside of university.

What does the university offer the student additionally? (E.g. Catering, sports facilities, laundry facilities?)

Not much as far as I know, the biggest disconnection for me was that there was no overarching body that facilitated Erasmus students to come together, like ISOW or ESN.

5.Housing-travelling-living

you sign up to their housing site, they will offer you a contract for a room, you can accept or reject on the basis of your preferences. I did not decline so I have no idea if they offer you another place a second time. Overall 10/10 arranged, compared to Wageningen this is absolutely great.

What is the culture of the country like? (E.g. Differences with home, local cuisine, habits, manners?)

It doesn't differ to much from the netherlands to be honest, food and climate wise, except everything is expensive. The biggest difference are that the days in winter are way shorter and you are going to spend a lot of time inside. This is apparently also in line with the culture, since I spent most of the time in my appartement. There is a 'clubbing' culture but it is a bit difficult to get integrated, here an overarching collective like ESN could help international students to find likeminded people more easily.

Could you give a general price indication of the place of residence compared to living in Wageningen?

I paid roughly 420 euro a month here, in Wageningen, it was more expensive, and I got less for 470 euros a month.

The best thing is to buy a bike, I had a car but you pay everywhere in the city, no place excluded. There are plenty of busses available as well.
