Every course only lasts one week. You start the course on Monday and you have your exam on Friday. The level is not as high as in Wageningen. Most of the exams were presentations. The workload was not really high.

The teachers are very approachable. The classes are really small, so the teachers really get to know you. In my class, there were only international students, so there wasn't really engagement with local students.

There is a restaurant on campus. The breakfast is free and lunch and dinner are both €3,30. You get a lot of food. There is a gym and a laundry room on campus.
