Due to the work-life balance culture of Denmark was the work pressure low. The academic level and exam level were equal. The lectures were very long (4 hours), but manageable due to the breaks.

Teachers are far more engaged with the students. They know each other and they recognize the strengths and weaknesses of a student. Because of the formal environment, it was easy to discuss matters with a teacher. Also, the courses were much smaller which give more room for in class discussions.

The catering of the school was excellent. During lunch, you could get a full healthy meal under 5 euros.

It is possible to rent a room via BDTU. It is also possible to arrange your own room. The problem with BDTU is that the rooms are expensive and the rental period is definite.
