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What is it like to study there?

Examination very much depends on the course, I only had one exam in the exam week, but had 5 essays due in this same week and the weeks around it.

What is the culture of the university?

TMU is a commuters university, which means people travel an hour to two hours to campus. But everyone is extremely friendly and it is easy to make friends with the local

students. The lecturers take the time to learn your name in most courses, and actually show interest in their students.

What does the university offer students additionally?

As an exchange student, you get free access to the sports facilities. There are a lot of different clubs and groups you can join too. There is some food provided on campus, but the university is surrounded by food places.

The public transport system in Toronto is great, you can get anywhere by public transport. There are metros, trams, buses, and trains. You can get a monthly subscription on your Presto card (travel card) at the local drug store for 128 CAD if you're a student. Otherwise, a single trip costs 3,30 CAD.
