a. What are the possibilities for housing?

E.g. Availability to sign up for a room on campus, private rooms, rent rates? When I was there, the student complex organized by the university was closed for renovation. So only private rent was possible. There were quite a few rooms ranging from studio's to room in shared apartment, to sharing a room with someone else. Rent rates in the city center (inside the walls) are expensive most of the time. I paid 580 all included. Hard to find something, start well in advance, it takes some time for some to respond. (don't try villa socini by Vittoria, the landlady is crazy)

b. What is the culture like?

E.g. Differences with home, local cuisine, habits, manners?

Good food. And don't dare say it is not, they will lynch you. A bit more focused on life, instead of working. And on health. It is a tranquil place, loved it for that. Learn to speak with your hands.

c. Could you give some information about public transport infrastructure?

E.g. Cost public transport card, taxi prices, how to travel to the university? Everything in Siena city walls is done on foot. Most of the time a walk from 5 min till 30, almost no cars. To the rest of Italy you can go by train, (flix) bus. Biking outside Siena is possible but a bit dangerous.
