People are quite friendly when you ask for the way around and there is also an app that can help you find the right buildings/classrooms. The buildings of the WUR are not as close together as the buildings of LIU, at LIU all the buildings are more at walking distance.

What does the university offer students additionally?

In every building you can get food and coffee. On top of that all the buildings have microwaves to heat up your food. There is a big gym on campus where you can play different sports (track, tennis etc.).

You have to sign up for different housing websites and some people can get housing through the university, but there are limited spots for this.
