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What is it like to study there?

I signed up for the uni sports facilities, which cost me 11 eu/month. Quite expensive, but since I had more free time I used it a lot.

I signed up for accommodation via the University, which is very easy, but I believe more expensive than finding something yourself. However, I highly recommend this! I lived on the Campus East location (the best!), which is a 5 minute walk to the beach and had a real community feeling. Every day, we all ate breakfast and dinner together in the cafeteria, which was very nice. I paid 800 euro/month, including breakfast and dinner.

What is the culture of the country like?

Australia is sunny, laid-back and people are outside a lot more than in the Netherlands.

Being active and in the sun is highly enjoyed.

Very easy and cheap, especially in the Sydney/Wollongong area. Check on/off with credit card. Free shuttle bus in Wollongong, connecting my accommodation, city centre and uni.
