Lecturers are approachable, though you won't meet them often and therefore getting prompt replies to questions is hard.

There are campus rooms. They are expensive and warm. I lived in a privately-owned shared house found through flatmates.com. It was a lot cheaper and a lot of fun.

Though, having a card is worthwhile in this country, because the cities themselves are a bit boring to me, the wider environment surely is not, with lots of wildlife and beautiful landscapes on offer.

Jobs in farming and mining are easy to get but are often not compatible with university studies. Jobs in cities are harder to obtain as Australians highly prefer hiring Australian nationals over work-eligible visa holders. This may be important if you expect any income while in Australia.
